## August Meeting Updates

#### ◆ August 7:

Major Christopher Isaacson and Mr. Charles Galloway updated the club on the Newport Army Depot expansion and the destruction of the VX nerve gas. The project is over budget and behind schedule. The Depot project is expected to be completed around June 2006.

#### ◆ August 14:

Tara Lane, Department of Redevelopment for Terre Haute and Vigo county, provided an update of the Terre Haute Arts Corridor. It is located on Seventh street from Poplar to Tippecanoe streets. The Arts Corridor first arose during the 1996 Vision for Terre Haute's Downtown area. In October 1997, ISU opened the Center for Arts. In 1998, Arts Illiana instituted it's Crossroads Arts Fest. In 1999, the Sheldon Swope Art Museum completed the first floor renovation and in 2000 completed it's second floor renovation. The Federal Government has provided funding for the Post Office

which will preserve its WPA murals and interior and exterior Art Deco architecture. Funding for the Cherry street project will include a 500 space parking garage. Millions of dollars have been and will be spent to improve the Terre Haute Arts Corridor.

#### ◆ August 21:

David Frederick, Riley Memorial Assoc., updated us on the Association's activities with Riley's Children's Hospital, the James Whitcomb Riley home, and Bradford Woods—home for Camp Riley. Having just celebrated its 75th year, the Riley Association provides significant fund raising support to Riley's Children's hospital which provides health care for Indiana children. Although located in Indianapolis, Riley Hospital is truly a Hoosier hospital. Terre Haute native and ISU graduate, Dr. David Williams, is an important part of Riley's medical staff as a recognized physician in child cancer research. Dr. Williams is the brother to fellow Rotarian, Steve Williams.
